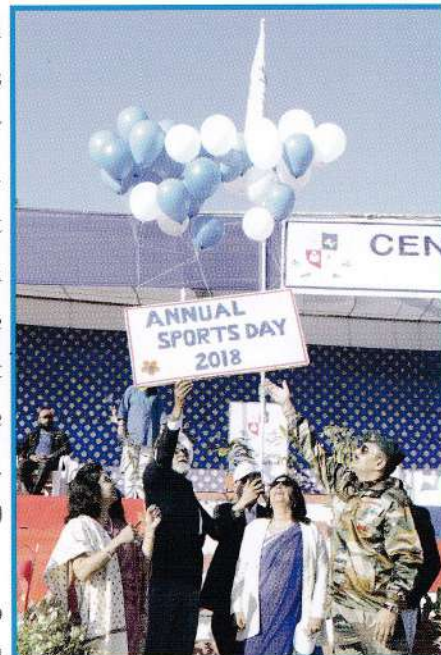

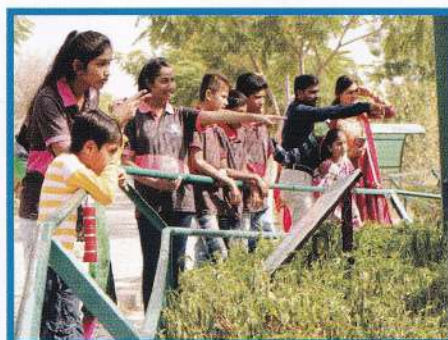
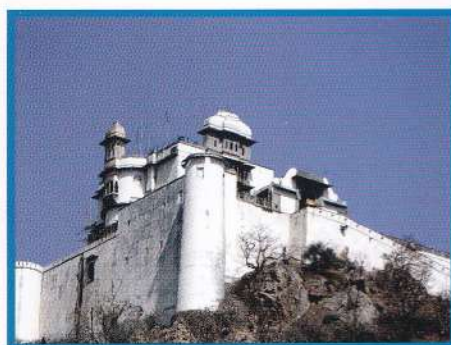
ATTRACTIONS IN BIOLOGICAL PARK

THE TINY TOTS VISITED LOK KALA MANDAL

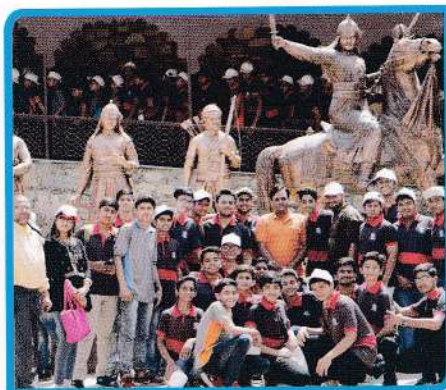
